Minute of the Meeting

Hon'ble Chairman welcomed all esteemed members present and extended New Year Greetings to all. He then requested the Secretary to place the agenda before the house one by one.

Agenda-1: Confirmation of minutes of 15th, 16th and 17th meeting of the Executive Council.

Hon'ble Vice Chancellor read out the resolutions of last three meetings and also explained the action taken report.

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Resolution No. RTU/ EC/18/1/06.02.2026

The House unanimously confirmed the minutes of all three meetings.

Agenda No 2. Approval of Lists of Graduates of 2025 examined for conferment of Degrees during 3rd Convocation to be held on 28th January 2026.

Controller of Examinations Dr. Subhajit Chakraborty placed before the house the detailed list of graduates who have been examined and found qualified for conferment of degrees both in person and in absentia.

Resolution No. RTU/ EC/18/2/ 06.02.2026

The House unanimously approved the list of Graduating Students who are to be conferred degrees by Hon'ble Chancellor in 3rd convocation to be held on 28th January 2026. Further the Executive Council Congratulated all graduating students for their achievements.

Agenda No 3. Adopting Assam Civil Service Role (Appeal & Discipline) 1964 for Teaching and Administrative staff.

Secretary to Executive Council Dr. Sandip Ratna placed before the house the copies of Assam Civil Service Rule (Discipline & Appeal) 1964 for consideration of the house

Resolution No. RTU/ EC/18/3/ 06.02.2026

After detail discussion the house resolved to adopt Assam Civil Service Rule (Discipline & Appeal) 1964 as the service rule (Discipline & Appeal) for Rabindranath Tagore University **Teachers and Administrative Staffs with immediate effect.** It is resolved that in case of controversy between Assam Civil Service Rule and RTU Acts and Statute, the provisions of Acts and Statute shall prevail. During all advertisement the service rule should clearly be mentioned for avoiding controversy in future.

Agenda No 4. Adopting RTU Service Role (For Gr-III & Gr-IV staff)

Secretary to Executive Council Dr. Sandip Ratna placed before the house the prepared Service Rule (For Gr-III & Gr-IV staff) of Rabindranath Tagore University. He explained that the same has been prepared by Dy COE Mr. Goutam Sarma in consultation with him which aligns with the Service Rule (For Gr-III & Gr-IV staff) of Gauhati University.

The House also approved the leave rule for Rabindranath Tagore University with certain modifications.

Resolution No. RTU/ EC/18/4/ 06.02.2026

The Members after thorough discussion resolved to adopt the same as the Service Rule of Rabindranath Tagore University with immediate effect (For Gr-III & Gr-IV staff) with certain modification in regard to Compulsory leave for contesting Elections. It is also resolved that this service rule be uploaded in University Website for proper circulation.

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Agenda No 5: Matter related to Appointment of Registrar and Court case related expenses.

Chairman stated that this agenda item will have two parts (i) Matter arising out of Advt for the post of Regular Registrar and (ii) Court case related expenses. He placed before the house a detailed report on the matter as under....

A. Advertisement, Extension of Last Date, and Receipt of Applications

The post of Registrar was advertised vide Advertisement No. 35/2025 dated 29/05/2025 with the last date of submission fixed as 15/07/2025. Subsequently, the last date was extended up to 30th August vide Notification No. RTU/EST-11/3888 dated 07/07/2025.

It was noticed that certain applications were returned by the office of the Registrar (i/c) instead of being duly received. Consequently, a notification was published on the University website on 07/07/2025 requesting such candidates to resubmit their applications. A three-member Enquiry Committee was constituted to ascertain the reasons for the return of applications.

B. Constitution of Screening Committee and Provisional Screening

As per the resolution of the 16th Executive Council Meeting, a Screening Committee was constituted and a Member Secretary for the Selection Committee was appointed. The Screening Committee screened 12 applications, including that of Dr. Shekhar Kanti Sarkar, Dy Registrar and submitted its report on 13/11/2025.

A provisional screening list was published on the same date; wherein certain candidates were asked to submit additional documents within seven (7) days as their eligibility could not be conclusively ascertained from the documents initially submitted. Annexure-B

C. Filing of WP(C) No. 6700 of 2025 by Registrar (i/c)

All candidates complied with the requirement of submitting additional documents within the stipulated period. However, instead of submitting the documents, Dr. Shekhar Kanti Sarkar, Dy. Registrar with additional charge of Registrar(i/c), filed WP(C) No. 6700 of 2025 before the Hon'ble Gauhati High Court alleging that:

1. Only five applications were received within the due date, whereas the provisional list included twelve candidates; and
2. Calling for additional documents amounted to an unlawful change of eligibility criteria.

D. Conflict of Interest and Emergency Administrative Action

As per relevant clauses of the RTU Act and Statutes, the Registrar:

- Is the Ex-officio Secretary of the Executive Council [RTU Statute 4.2.4.1]
- Represents the University before courts of law [RTU Statute 4.2.4.8], and
- Is the custodian of all University records RTU [Act Clause 16 (i)]

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In WP(C) No. 6700 of 2025, the Executive Council was impleaded as Respondent No. 2, creating a clear conflict of interest, as Dr. Shekhar Kanti Sarkar Dy Registrar with additional charge of Registrar (i/c) himself was the petitioner.

Considering the urgency, and as the matter was listed in the court on 26th November 2025, the Vice-Chancellor, exercising powers under Clause 13(4) of the RTU Act, relieved Dr. Shekhar Kanti Sarkar from the additional charge of Registrar and appointed Dr. Sandip Ratna, Academic Registrar, as Registrar (i/c) on 25th November 2025. Handing over and taking over was completed on the same day. Annexure–D

E. Ratification by Executive Council

The 17th Executive Council, in its meeting held on 26th November 2025 at 9:00 AM, ratified the action taken by the Vice-Chancellor. Annexure–E

F. Second Writ Petition and Status Quo Order

On 26th November 2025, Dr. Shekhar Kanti Sarkar filed WP(C) No. 6719 of 2025, challenging the decision of the Vice-Chancellor and the Executive Council. The Hon'ble Court passed an order of status quo. Consequently, Dr. Sandip Ratna Academic Registrar continues as Registrar (i/c), and the selection process for regular Registrar has been kept on hold. Annexure–F

G. Status of Court Proceedings

The Standing Counsel of RTU filed detailed reply affidavits in both writ petitions. Although listed on 9th December 2025, the hearing was deferred at the request of the petitioner. The matters are now fixed for hearing on 8th January 2026. Annexure–G

Issues Raised in Reply Affidavit (Individual Annexures)

H. UGC Derecognition of KSOU LL.M. Degree

Dr. Sarkar submitted an LL.M. marksheet of Karnataka State Open University (2014) without a supporting certificate. UGC, vide Notification F. No. UGC/DEB/2013 dated 14/10/2013, derecognized all KSOU degrees beyond 2012–13 due to non-compliance with UGC Regulations. At the time of his appointment as Deputy Registrar, LL.M. was his only postgraduate qualification, thereby placing the appointment under serious scrutiny. Annexure–H

Vide letter no. KSOU/EB/Coll.Instt/File-01B/2025-26 dated 03.01.2026 Karnataka State Open University has stated that Dr. Shekhar Kanti Sarkar pursued his LLM degree from the Erstwhile Collaborative Institute of the University which did not obtain necessary approval from the concerned regulatory body.

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Education Officer of University Grants Commission vide letter dated 2.1.2026 intimated that “The UGC has not granted any approval to Karnataka State Open University to open off campus/study centre anywhere”.

UGC has further clarified that Karnataka State Open University did not have UGC recognition from the period 2013-14 to 2017-18

Even during the period of recognition (2007-8 to 2012-13) Karnataka State Open University was required to offer courses as approved by the statutory authority of the university after seeking approval from regulatory authority wherever applicable.

It is worth mentioning that the petitioner got his LLM 4th semester marksheet from Karnataka State Open In 2014 (when the University did not have UGC recognition). More over LLM programme of Karnataka State Open University in distance mode was not approved by concerned Regulatory Authority (In instant case the Bar Council of India).

I. Territorial Jurisdiction Violation by KSOU

Since 2001, State Universities have been prohibited from operating beyond their territorial jurisdiction. The Hon’ble Supreme Court in Prof. Yashpal & Anr. vs. State of Chhattisgarh & Ors. (2005) held that such operations are illegal without statutory authorization. Any LL.M. programme offered by KSOU outside Karnataka is therefore legally invalid. Annexure-I

Education Officer of University Grants Commission vide letter dated 2.1.2026 intimated that “The UGC has not granted any approval to Karnataka State Open University to open off campus/study centre anywhere”.

J. Discrepancy in University Registration Numbers

Dr. Sarkar’s 4th Semester marksheet bears Registration No. 11762LLM003, whereas his 2nd Semester marksheet bears Registration No. 1178LLM0031. A single student cannot have two registration numbers for the same course, clearly indicating non-genuine documents. Annexure-J

K. Non-recognition of Distance Mode LL.M. by BCI

The Bar Council of India does not recognize LL.M. programmes offered in distance or correspondence mode. Consequently, the LL.M. allegedly pursued from KSOU was never approved by BCI and could not have valid DEB-UGC recognition. Annexure-K

L. Public Statement of BCI (The Hindu Report)

Reports published in The Hindu confirm that BCI declared LL.M. programmes offered online or in hybrid mode without BCI approval to be invalid for employment, academics, research, and judiciary. KSOU’s LL.M. programme was never approved by BCI. Annexure-L

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M. BCI Official Communication Dated 28/06/2025

Vide Letter No. BCI: D4615/2025, BCI clarified that LL.M. in distance mode contravenes the Advocates Act, 1961, BCI Legal Education Rules, 2008 & 2020, and binding Supreme Court judgments in Vinit Garg vs. UGC and Odisha Lift Irrigation Corporation Ltd. vs. Patro. Annexure–M

N. Submission of Forged Experience Certificates

Two experience certificates submitted by Dr. Sarkar from Mahapurusha Srimanta Shankardeva Vishwavidyalaya (MSSV) were verified. Vide Letter No. MSSV/R/27(AM)/2017/32170 dated 19/12/2025, MSSV confirmed that the certificates were never issued, establishing submission of forged documents. Annexure–N

O. Missing Personal File Documents

Dr. Sarkar's application submitted during his appointment as Deputy Registrar is missing from his personal file. It was reported that he took the file from Mr. Chandra Kalita, assuring its return, which was never done. A written report has been submitted by Mr. Kalita. Annexure–O

P. Misconduct During Selection Process at IIT Guwahati

Dr. Sarkar remained present at IIT Guwahati during a selection process where his wife was a candidate, without leave or station permission. He unauthorizedly verified documents and attempted to influence the selection process, constituting serious misconduct. Annexure–P

Engagement of Standing Counsel

The Chairman Also placed before the house that as Standing Counsel has been engaged to defend the case for protection of the interest of the University before Hon'ble Court, fees in actual needed to be paid to the Standing Counsel.

Resolution No. RTU/ EC/18/5/ 06.02.2026

(i) Regarding Court Cases arising out of the Advertisement for the Post of Registrar

The house resolved that University should contest in both the cases with all actual facts and figures so as to protect the interest and dignity of the University. **The appointment process of Registrar be kept on hold till further instructions from Hon'ble Court comes.**

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- (ii) Expenses of the court cases including retainer fees and legal fees of Standing Counsel.

Executive Council authorized Vice Chancellor to meet all the expenses of the court case including Standing Counsel Fees etc from University fund against necessary bills and vouchers. Also, Executive Council resolved that Standing Counsel Mr. S K Medhi be paid an annual retainer fee of Rs 1,00,000/- (Rupees One Lakh only) so as to enable the University to take legal advice time to time regarding IIC, MoU, RTI etc. The House resolved that Standing Counsel should be a member of ICC. Further EC resolved that there is no need of two Standing Counsels considering the fund position of the university as such Mr. Nabarun Nath should be relieved from the responsibility of the standing counsel of the University with immediate effect.

Agenda No 6. Appointment of Library Assistant from the panel

Secretary to Executive Council informed the house that Ms. Jonali Das who was appointed as Library Assistant recently has resigned from the job joining as TET teacher in some school. As such the post is lying vacant. During her selection process the Selection Committee prepared a panel of three candidates as follows...

1. Ms. Jonali Das
2. Sri Shyamal Baishya
3. Ms. Bidisha Bora

The six-month validity period of the panel is over in September 2025. However, there is a provision that Executive Council may extend the validity panel for another six months. The matter was placed before the members for consideration.

Resolution No. RTU/ EC/18/6/ 06.02.2026

The House resolved to extend the panel prepared on 07-03-2025 by the Selection Committee for another six months considering the facts that arranging interview for only one post arranging written test, personal interview inviting experts is expensive. It is also resolved that serial no 2 in the panel be appointed. In case the candidate does not turn up candidate in serial no 3 may be appointed.

It is further resolved that validity of all such panel be extended for one year so as to minimize the expenditure of selection and if any vacancy appears within the period of one year in respective panel the 2nd in panel (if any) may be offered appointment.

Agenda No 7. Any other items with the permission of the Chair.

- (i) Issues related to validity of appointment of Dy Registrar Dr. Shekhar Kanti Sarkar.

Resolution No. RTU/ EC/18/7(i)/ 06.02.2026

The house expressed serious concern about the misconduct and forged activities of Dr. Shekhar Kanti Sarkar, Deputy Registrar of Rabindranath Tagore University, Hojai, Assam. After detailed discussion on the report submitted by the Chairman under Agenda no 5,

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the members of the Executive Council are of opinion that the appointment of Dr. Shekhar Kanti Sarkar to be post of Deputy Registrar of Rabindranath Tagore University which happened in 2023 is under question as his LLM degree is reported to be invalid and at the time of joining Rabindranath Tagore University he had only LLM degree as his PG degree which is essential qualification for the post of Deputy Registrar. Moreover, the experience certificates from Mahapurush Srimanta Shankardev University submitted by Dr Sarkar, based on which his qualification to the post of Deputy Registrar was considered in 2023 at Rabindranath Tagore University are Fake. Also, his Ph.D. degree from Assam University based on LLM degree in distance mode from Karnataka State Open University is also under question. Therefore, the house unanimously resolved that appropriate legal steps should be taken against Dr. Shekhar Kanti Sarkar, Deputy Registrar taking legal opinion from Standing Counsel by issuing notice, show cause, initiating Departmental Proceedings etc as per law. Executive Council authorized Vice Chancellor to take all appropriate steps permitted by Law in this regard as Chairman of the Executive Council so as to maintain the sanctity of the University.

(ii) Life Time Achievement Award

The Committee constituted for the purpose of selection of Awardee submitted its report on 5th January 2026.

Resolution No. RTU/ EC/18/7(ii)/ 06.02.2026

The House Approved the decision of the Selection Committee and resolved that this year Life Time Achievement Award from the field of CURUTE be offered to Sri Paban Bordoloi.

(iii) Professor of Practice

Chairman apprised the house that Rabindranath Tagore University desired to initiate Professor of Practice as per NEP 2020 and contacted the Governor's House. Accordingly, Governor's House has come up with SOP for the Same. As per the SOP in the process of selection of Professor of Practice, Governor's nominee should be there. Rabindranath Tagore University has accordingly requested Governor's House to nominate three nominees one each for Science and Technology. Social Science and Humanities and Management.

Resolution No. RTU/ EC/18/7(iii)/ 06.02.2026

The House appreciated the initiative and authorised Vice Chancellor to initiate the process as per the SOP as and when the nominees are nominated by the Governor. Action taken by the Vice Chancellor in this regard is approved.

(iv) Science Laboratory in J C Bose Campus

Vice Chancellor apprised the house that in the new campus there in extreme need of creating Science Laboratory as to provide laboratory facility to the UG and PG students. From SOPD grant the lab was proposed but the grant is yet to be sanctioned. There is a grant of 1.5 cr lying with Chief Engineer office but because of problem related to Head of Accounts change this

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grant is not available to be utilized at this moment. He proposed that from reserved fund this expenditure may be incurred as establishment of Science laboratory is urgent. Proposed estimated expenditure is approx. 60 Lakhs. The House suggested that for SOPD grant Vice Chancellor may directly contact DHE, Assam.

Resolution No. RTU/ EC/18/7(iv)/ 06.02.2026

The house resolved that if fund can be arranged locally, proposed laboratory may be established by floating Notice Inviting Tender in website and newspaper and following all financial rule as per GFR to avoid any problem related to Audit.

(v) AMTRON Internship matter

Chairman reported that University signed MoU with AMTRON for providing internship to RTU students. Certain amount of fees was fixed for the same to be paid to AMTRON. It is noticed later on that in the name of AMTRON Internship fee collection some of our staff namely Kanchan Debnath, Krishna Kanta Roy and Tushal Sagra collected money (approx. Rs.7 Lakhs) from the students in their personal bank accounts. Kanchan Debnath collected fees in the bank account of Mrs Malati Debnath who is reported to be his mother. Show Cause notice was served but as the reply was not satisfactory one-man enquiry has been initiated and the enquiry is in progress. After receiving show cause notice these staff directly transferred the money from their account to the bank account of one employee of AMTRON without crediting the money to University account. Chairman reported that once the enquiry will be complete the report will be placed before EC for taking appropriate action.

Resolution No. RTU/ EC/18/7(v)/ 06.02.2026

Executive Council expressed its serious concern about the gross financial anomaly and resolved that till the enquiry is complete and the matter is settled in favour of the alleged staffs their service confirmation be kept on hold for minimum additional six month.

(vi) Lien Matter

Vide resolution of 15th Executive Council Dr. Manoj Kr. Swami and Dr. Nageshwar Yadav was granted leave on lien for one year to join as Associate Professor in GIA mode of RTU. Their Lien is going to be completed in Marh 2026 and they will be completing their probation in new post in March 2026.

Resolution No. RTU/ EC/18/7(vi)/ 06.02.2026

Executive Council resolved that service of Dr. Manoj Kr. Swami and Dr. Nageswar Jadav be confirmed against respective post of RTU (GIA Cadre) with effect from completion of their probation of one year.

(vii) Service Confirmation matter

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Service Confirmation matter of teaching and non-teaching staff (Annexure-A) was placed in the house.

Resolution No. RTU/ EC/18/7(vii)/ 06.02.2026

The House resolved that subject to police verification report the service of the incumbent teaching and non-teaching staffs as mentioned in Annexure-A be confirmed with effect from respective date of their completion of probation period. The House resolved that since the service of Dr. Nageswar Jadav and Dr. Manoj Kr. Swami have been confirmed against RTU post, the service of Dr. Pranjal Kumar Nath and Dr. Monish Tomar who were appointed against respective lien vacancies (mentioning in the advt. "likely to be permanent") of Dr. Nageswar Jadav and Dr. Manoj Kr. Swami be regularized with effect from their date of joining against lien vacancy. However, their service confirmation will be with effect from completion of one year of service from initial date of joining subject to submission of police verification report.

(viii) Pay Protection matter of Academic Registrar

Resolution No. RTU/ EC/18/7(viii)/ 06.02.2026

Pay protection matter of Academic Registrar was discussed and it is resolved that the protection be granted as per rule.

(ix) Ratification of Holiday List

Resolution No. RTU/ EC/18/7(ix)/ 06.02.2026

The House ratified the holiday list prepared keeping provision for 90 working days in a semester.

(x) Revival of the post of Principal Hojai College

It was reported that there was a permanent post of Principal in Hojai College which was converted to Registrar in charge during upgradation of the college to University. Later on, the post became silent.

Resolution No. RTU/ EC/18/7(x)/ 06.02.2026

Executive Council resolved that letter may be written to Higher Education Department for revival of the post converting it to a post of Professor.

(xi) University Quarter matter

It was reported that there are two quarter in the old campus of the University temporarily occupied by the previous Night Guards. Since their services have been regularized and security aspect of the University has been handed over to Security Agency, these two quarter should be vacated.

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Resolution No. RTU/ EC/18/7(xi)/ 06.02.2026

Executive Council resolved that both the quaterd be vacated immediately and fresh allotment be made as per requirement after framing SOP for the same mentioning License fees, Leave and License agreement etc.

(xii) Equipment purchase matter and Legal Notice

Registrar reported that once company who supplied equipment during the tenure of former Vice Chancellor sent legal notice for nonpayment of bill. He reported that the whole matter has been sent to University Standing Counsel for opinion. It is reported that the payment could not be processed as there were issues related to procurement process.

Resolution No. RTU/ EC/18/7(xii)/ 06.02.2026

Executive Council resolved that the matter may be taken care of as per opinion of the University Standing Counsel. Report of the Standing Counsel be placed in next EC for decision.

(xiii) Advertisement for the post of Asstt Professor in Pol Sc and Head Assistant

Secretary to EC reported that as Dr. P S Prasad has expired premature and Head Assistant is going to superannuate in the month of March, these two posts need to be filled up.

Resolution No. RTU/ EC/18/7(xiii)/ 06.02.2026

It is resolved that advertisement for these two posts be made and recruitment process be completed. If the HA post is promotional appropriate action be taken accordingly.

(xiv) Matter related to IGNOU and KKHSOU centers.

Secretary reported that for functioning pattern of both IGNOU and KKHSOU centers present in the University administration is in complete dark. Even Coordinator of IGNOU was appointed without involving University Authority.

Resolution No. RTU/ EC/18/7(xiv)/ 06.02.2026

EC resolved that the matter should be formalized by preparing fresh SOP and by signing fresh MoU with concerned open university. In no way the centers should function without involvement of University Authority.

(xv) Matter related to letter received from Governor's House.

The Chairman reported the house that some pseudonymous Anjan Bordoloi submitted a complaint to Governor House that Rabindranath Tagore University is convening the meeting of Executive Council on 6th January violating the Status quo interim order of Hon'ble Gauhati High Court. Governor House has requested University to take appropriate action as deem

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necessary. Accordingly, a reply was given to Governor House clarifying University's stand. The Chairman read out the letter.

Resolution No. RTU/ EC/18/7(xv)/ 06.02.2026

Executive Council endorsed the reply sent to Governor House by the Vice Chancellor and opined that such fake complaint should not be entertained.

(xvi) Academic Council matters

Secretary placed before the House the relevant agenda of Academic Council matter

Resolution No. RTU/ EC/18/7(xvi)/ 06.02.2026

The House approved the decision of opening Hotel and Hospitality Management, B.Sc Nursing and School of Technology in Dima Hasao campus of the University in Self Finance Mode.

(xvii) Opening PG in Affiliated colleges

Resolution No. RTU/ EC/18/7(xvii)/ 06.02.2026

It is resolved that subject to permission by Govt of Assam, University may send inspection team to the colleges proposed to start PG courses. On satisfactory inspection report the colleges may start PG courses subject to approval of Academic Council.


